International Pali Conference – 2018

The Department of Pali and Buddhist Studies, University of Peradeniya organizes the International Pali Conference (IPC) in 2018 for the fourth consecutive year. It is scheduled to be held in the University premises on 30th of October, 2018. In the last three conferences, a great enthusiasm from the community of scholars in Pali studies was witnessed. The newcomers to the field also got the opportunity to present their research in those events. As an annual event held in the medium of Pali, the lingua franca of Theravada Buddhism, with an international audience, the participants find it to be one of the rarest opportunities to come across.

The theme of IPC-2018 is “An Exposition of Meditation Praxis” (Bhāvanā-naya-vibhāvanā). The methods of mental culture play a significant role generally in many religions and particularly in the religions of Indian origin. Out of them, possibly the Buddhist meditational techniques are the most recognized in both popular and scholarly levels. This recognition shares much with the perception of Buddhism as a system of psychology. Moreover, Buddhist meditation encompasses a wide variety of traditions from several eras and locations. The organizers of this year have realized that this kind of topic can take scholars and practitioners together to work on integrating their areas of interest.

The organizing committee of IPC-2018 consists of the academics of the Department of Pali and Buddhist Studies, University of Peradeniya. Dr. H. M. Mahinda Herath, a senior lecturer in Pali studies from the University of Peradeniya holds the conference chair. The keynote speech will be delivered by Ven. Prof. Medagampitiye Vijithadhamma from the University of Sri Jayawardenepura, a prominent young scholar in Pali studies with an international repute. The organizing committee invites those who are enthusiastic to participate in the event by submitting papers, present their research, and enriching discussions.
