Workshop on socio-political research & assessment for INGOs/NGOs

INGOs and NGOs need to develop their own capabilities to assess the socio-political environment they plan to service. Reliance upon government, military intelligence or other aid providers risks perceptions that the INGO/NGO is aligned to a particular government or political faction. While larger INGOs/NGOs may enjoy their own security and intelligence personnel, it is expensive to operate and removes resources from the core business of providing aid.

This workshop aims to assist INGOs and NGOs develop skills in socio-political research and assessment that will better inform their decision making processes. The workshop is presented by Charles Sturt University academics: Dr Henry Prunckun who lectures in Intelligence Analysis and Security; and Dr Troy Whitford who lectures in Australian and Asian political history as well as researches in the field of politics and the empowerment of citizens.
