In February 2022 the Quality Board members of each institution of the project were actively involved in completing the 2nd Year Internal Quality Assurance Report that was discussed and approved during the Quality Assurance Board Meeting in 11th of March 2022. The main aim of the Internal Quality Assurance Report is to evaluate the quality of the developed project products and to assess the effective implementation of the project activities during the first two years of the project.

To collect the partners' viewpoints on the project implementation after the 2nd year of the project, an online survey was conducted and respondents from the eight partners involved in the project answered this survey and therefore the statistical interpretation adds great value of the results. Furthermore, based on the data collected, the report aims to identify project strengths and weaknesses, suggest actions or recommendations on moving forward and how to adjust the activities to pandemic conditions and the one-year extension.



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Furthermore, based on the data collected, the report aims to identify project strengths and weaknesses, suggest actions or recommendations on moving forward and how to adjust the activities to pandemic conditions and the one-year extension.

Thus, the project coordinator and the project management committee urged to react promptly and to redesign workflow for key processes: internal communication using online platforms and collaborative working software; flexible deadlines, i.e., postponing or extending deadlines according to partners' needs and local epidemiological context; assessing modification in planned methodology to reach outcomes and keep the quality on a high level; adapting dissemination strategy and using new communication channels.






Figure 1. I am highly motivated to contribute to the project (count of answers)

Figure 2. I think the other partners are highly motivated to contribute to the project (count of answers)



The long-felt need of a Special Needs Unit for the University of Ruhuna was fulfiilled on the 27th of July 2022 with the financial support and guidance of the IncEdu Project.

The Special Needs Unit was ceremonially opened by the Vice Chancellor, Senior Professor Sujeewa Amarasena and was attended by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Professor Saman Chandana Ediriweera, The Dean, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences,- Professor Upali Pannilage, Heads of Departments and members of the academic and non-academic staff.

The Centre facilitates the learning of students, who for a wide variety of reasons require additional support and specialized equipment to accommodate their learning disabilities and difficulties that hinder their higher education process which often result in making them feel unequal to their peers in learning exercises as well as in quality of life.

Having recognized this, a team from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences embarked on the mission to make inclusive education a more plausible reality for such students thereby making them live a life of contentment, joy and self-sufficiency. The culmination of it was the SNU which consists of two compartments located in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences with an easily accessible ramp for the convenience of such students.

It is equipped with facilities for online and on- site learning making it an all-purpose room where the students with disabilities will be able to carry out their learning tasks and their evaluation processes right at the same spot. It is believed that the students with special needs will reap the full benefits of this latest addition to the university.

University of Ruhuna successfully conducted an awareness session on Building disability awareness, supporting students with disabilities during higher education on 11th November 2021 with participants over 80.


