6. Exchange Student Requirements (common):

- Affiliation: Undergraduate/graduate students from an overseas university that has a student-exchange agreement with our university.
- **Grade:**
 1. Undergraduate students: 2nd year or higher.
 2. Graduate students: No grade requirement
- **Status:** Students need to be enrolled at the university in your country during the exchange period, from application to returning to your country.
- **Health condition:** Person with a designated medical certificate issued by a doctor to verify that students are physically and mentally healthy enough to study abroad.
- **Language ability:** Students is expected to meet the Japanese and/or English requirements of each faculty or graduate school.
- **Admission process:**
 1. Application: Submit all necessary common documents and documents for each faculty or graduate school.
(*Need to submit the required documents through the university staff in charge of exchange program in your university. We cannot accept the application through the student individually.)
 2. Screening: Admission is based on the judgment of each faculty or graduate school. In addition, if there are applications exceeding the capacity, admission may not be accepted even if the requirements have been met.

3. Permission: Supervisor will be decided for each students and Letter of Acceptance(LoA) will be issued when each faculty or graduate school permit to accept student.
4. Application for Certificate of Eligibility(CoE): Apply for CoE to Immigration Bureau as soon as LoA is issued.
5. Application for visa: We send original CoE and LoA to the university staff in charge of exchange program in your university. Students apply for visa with bringing them to Japanese Embassy in your country.
6. Schedule arrangement to ente Japan: UoM staff arrange the schedule for students' entry into Japan accoding to Japanese government's quarantine measures.
(*UoM book flights (both international and domestic) and accommodations depending on Japanese border measures)
7. Entrance: Semester start from October 1st.
(*Due to world events such as the COVID-19 pandemic, there is a possibility that some students may not be able to enter Japan in time for the start of the semester on October 1st.)

7. Number of Students Accepted:

- Faculty of Education: The total number of students of Program A and B must be 3 or less
- Faculty of Engineering: 1 or 2 students per program
- Faculty of Agriculture: 1 student per department
- Faculty Regional Innovation: Up to 2 students
- Graduate School of Agriculture: 1 student per course

Faculties and graduate schools that do not show a fixed capacity will accept within the range of the memorandum of understanding on student exchange between the institutions.
