women in Fukuoka started their education movement
100 years ago. They yearned for and demanded access
to higher education, which was then regarded as
unnecessary for women. Among many who echoed
the women's aspiration and plea, the Governor of the
Prefecture of Fukuoka, as well as the Mayor of the
City of Fukuoka, took actions that resulted in the
establishment of the very first local public women's
college (joshi semmon gakko) in Japan, which became
Fukuoka Women's University (FWU) in 1950.

As we celebrate the 100 years of education rooted in the spirit of women who have imagined and worked tirelessly to create "what is not yet", we are proud to announce the opening of our Women's Leadership Center (WLC). In these times of VUCA (volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity), the power of imagination—looking beyond the given, beyond what appears to be unchangeable—is of utmost importance in working toward the realization of well-being for all. # "Unleashing the 'Self' to Lead, to Imagine What Is Not Yet"

Having worked for an architecture firm, Mr. Wakamiya went on to study aesthetics at the Faculty of Letters at the University of Tokyo, to further explore art at the Graduate School of Humanities and Sociology. While at NTT DoCoMo, then at DeNA, he spearheaded a number of new projects, and in 2017 founded his own company "uni" que", to be awarded "The 2018 Sugoi Venture (the "wow" start-ups) 100". He has written and spoken extensively on start-ups, art-thinking, diversity and communities. He is the author of "Hau Tu Art-Thinking (hows on art-thinking)" and "Art Shikou Doriru (drills on art-thinking)".

Born in Kitakyushu, Fukuoka, Ms. Motomura studied psychology and communication at Kyushu University, and started her journalist career at the Mainichi Newspapers' Kyushu Head Office. Winner of the 2006 Science Journalist Awards (JASTJ Awards), she has been renowned for her work in science communication to the public. Her most recent work is "Kagaku No Torisetsu (how to approach science)", a full-of-wit, easy-to-read essay on everyday science. Her personal account as a cancer survivor has touched many of those in suffering.

## Our History

There were enormous challenges in becoming a university, including fund-raising and licensing procedures. Both the Ministry of Education and the Prefectural Government of Fukuoka initially backed the idea of creating a two-year junior college rather than a four-year university. Nevertheless, the teaching faculty, alumnae, students, and the local community imagined in chorus and worked for what was not yet, resulting in the status being raised to a four-year university. Had it not been for their imagination and work, we would not have become what we are.
