Time Allocation (Hours): Supervised Independent Research: 300

Course Description:

The undergraduate dissertation project within a chosen specialization is an individual study that must include substantial new data or ideas showing originality. This includes search, studies and summary of scholarly/scientific literature, practical work in the chosen field, compilation and critical analysis of the results, and oral and written presentation. The undergraduate dissertation is mastered under individual supervision. The supervision includes how to perform a scientific study and how to orally and in writing present gathered

data or ideas in acceptable scientific manner. The supervisor must have documented scientific experience. The students must submit a complete written dissertation as a partial fulfillment of the degree. The Dissertation Writing Guidelines will be prepared and used.
