Producing Unique Sociologists: Department of Sociology, University of Peradeniya

The Department of Sociology of the University of Peradeniya is the largest and the best-known Sociology Department in the University system in Sri Lanka. Since its establishment in 1949 the Department of Sociology has grown in reputation, academic achievement and research output. Initially the student numbers were deliberately kept low, but since the 1970s enrollments increased, following the introduction of Sociology in Sinhala and Tamil media. At present, the Department of Sociology is one of the largest departments in the Faculty of Arts with well over 2000 students following Special and General degree courses and Postgraduate courses. This is the only Sociology Department within the whole university system in the country that teaches in all three national languages and, therefore, fully representative of the ethnic and socio-cultural diversity in the country.

Among the pioneering sociologists associated with the Department were the Prof. Bryce Ryan, Prof. Ralph Pieris, Prof. S.J. Tambiah, Prof. Gananath Obeyesekere, Prof. Laksiri Jayasuriya, Prof. Nur Yalman, Prof. E.R. Leach, Prof. H.L. Seneviratne and Prof. Kitsiri Malalgoda. Prof. K. Tudor Silva, Emeritus Prof. W. M. Sirisena and Prof. M. W. Amarasiri De Silva another prominent members who have served in the Department in the recent past.

The teaching and research programmes of the Department of Sociology had a strong academic orientation in the past. Recent changes in the curriculum and research activities of the staff indicate a deep concern with high priority national issues such as poverty, development, health, conflicts resolution and resettlement of people displaced by development schemes, war, natural disasters and environmental issues.

In 2004 the Department came first in a nationwide competition for awards for improving the quality and relevance of undergraduate education under the World Bank-funded IRQUE scheme. As part of this Project the Department embarked on a major project for curriculum and infrastructural development, partnerships with development agencies, internship for students, and post-graduate training of staff in abroad.

Departmental Journal:

Department has been publishing an annual journal called "Samaja Vimasuma" since the 1980s. Though the primary objective of the journal is to provide a platform for the academic staff of the department to present their research findings, contributions are also accepted from other departments as well. The Journal is very popular among both internal students and also students who are following the External Degree.

Sociological Association:

This was established by students following the Special Degree course in 1980s and, at present, it is an active body organizing many activities such as community outreach work, welfare programmes etc. under the patronage of the staff.

Academic Programmes:

The Department conducts two academic programmes, one Undergraduate and the other Postgraduate.

Undergraduate Programme:

Students can follow sociology as one of the subjects in their first year. Based on the performance at the end semester exams they can apply for the Special Degree Programme in sociology. Depending on the number of applications the department may conduct an interview or/and a written exam for selection. The number admitted to follow the special degree is around 60-65 per year.

From their second year to final year students follow a range of courses covering both theory and methodology. It is compulsory for students to take a course outside the discipline. The department pays special attention to enhance research skills and competencies in social research to meet the high demand for 'trained sociologists' from various institutes and organizations including the state sector. There are around 200 students are following special degree in sociology at present in 2nd, 3rd and 4th years.

Students who follow the General Degree and the Special Degree in other disciplines on the other hand can take selected courses from the Undergraduate Programme. Some of these courses, such as theory related and methodology related courses, are compulsory for the General Degree students. There are about 1700 students follow sociology as a subject.

Postgraduate Programme:

The postgraduate programme in Sociology has four levels as Diploma, Master of Arts (MA), Master of Philosophy(MPhil) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD). The Diploma in Sociology is one-year programme providing opportunity for those who do not possess a background in Sociology or a merit pass in their Special Degree to be qualified for MA in Sociology. The MA by course work is also a one-year degree. The M.Phil degree is a two-year degree with a thesis. Further, facilities are available for Ph.D. degrees as well. There are about 100 students following the graduate programme at present. The programme is conducted as a part-time programme in which the teaching is conducted in weekends only in order to accommodate employed students to attend the courses.
